

Provide Leadership in Migratory Bird Conservation

10.13 List

- Proposed rule published in November 2018 no substantial comments received
- To better align with most current 2019 American Ornithological Society updates...
- An amended proposed rule is expected to publish in fall
 - Expecting 30 day comment period Fall -Winter 2019
- Concurrent with the updated Migratory Bird Treaty Reform Act (MBTRA) notice for species not protected by MBTA
- If there are no comments for species that overlap with the Birds of Conservation Concern (BCC) list, the revised BCC list can be published at the close of the comment period



Hunting Regulations


- 2019-20 Season:
 - Final Frameworks published August 19
 - State Selections published August 28
 - Mostly unchanged from last year
 - Pintail bag limit decreased
 - AF Mallards also decreased
- Tribal Regulations:
 - Final rule for 2019-20 published August 27
- 2020-21 Season
 - Next SRC meeting Oct. 8-9, Minnesota

Double-crested Cormorants – Brief History

- August 2018: FWS held four Regional Meetings
- December 2018 : Summary report from meetings.

- March 2019: FWS hosted a meeting to summarize information gathered
 - ➤ Representatives from AFWA Bird and Fish Related Conflict Working Group and USDA Wildlife Services attended





Double-crested Cormorants - Next Steps

- Spring 2019: FWS identified possible management alternatives for consideration internally
- Summer 2019: Options under review

FWS is unable to release management options or speak to a proposed process until the Department of Interior review is complete



Common Ravens – Status of Process

- Common Raven conflicts in the western United States have reached a level should be addressed in a more comprehensive, programmatic fashion.
- A core team has been assembled comprising HQ and Regional leadership, APHIS, USGS, DOD, and States
- The team is currently discussing the appropriate stakeholder process to pursue
- Due to the complexity and the extent of the raven conflicts, it is anticipated this process will be lengthy
- Team is ramping up efforts over the next year



Federal Duck Stamp Program

- E-stamp program:
 - > 27 states currently participate
 - Applications due December 1 (see me for copy or online at https://www.fws.gov/migratorybirds/pdf/get-involved/ApplicationPackageElectronicFederalDuckStamp.pdf)
 - > States will not receive stamps at any of their individual licensing locations (safeguard States from financial and accounting liability)



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Conserve Habitat for Migratory Birds of Management Concern

DOI Financial Assistance Interior Regulation

- DOI Financial Assistance Interior Regulation (FAIR)
 - Supplements OMB Uniform Guidance
 - Final Rule published on August 30
 - Effective October 29
 - Applies to all DOI grants and cooperative agreements (NAWCA, NMBCA, etc.)
 - Highlights
 - real property reporting schedule
 - real property appraisals
 - foreign entities
 - conflict of interest

Manage Bird Data and Information for Use in Decision Making

Avian Knowledge Network

- Launched the Federal Avian Data Center
 - a node funded by Federal Agencies development led by FWS Migratory Bird Program
 - goal to provide tools to improve responsibilities for migratory birds
 - tools are applicable to wider audience than just federal agencies
 - e.g., geographical summary data tools, repository of BMPs and other guidance docs
- AKN new look webpage, improved function and useability
 - quickly becoming a one-stop tool for data and information for migratory bird conservation community


Harvest Surveys Modernization

On-line hunter diary survey deployed 2019-20 hunting season

- Limited deployment: 10 states, 9000 hunters invited/state
- Comparison of response rates, bag/hunter between paper and online survey (also paper vs. email invitations)
- Continue full paper survey for 3 years to provide overlap in harvest estimates

 Also, new web pages with visualization of harvest data (<u>www.fws.gov/harvestsurvey</u>)

- Advantages:
 - Reduce cost
 - Improve hunter experience:
 - optimized for mobile (field use)
 - download/print hunt log
 - Improvement in response rates and data quality





Manage Bird Data and Information for Use in Decision Making

May Survey Review

Objectives:

- Identify appropriate spatial extent and temporal period for priority species/populations
- Provide recommendations to improve survey design and estimation methodology
- Address biases in observation with recommendations of improved field protocols
- Identify optimal multi-species sampling effort allocation

Progress to date:

- IAA with USGS to provide statistical and analytical support
- Drs. John Sauer and Emily Silverman, co-Pls
- 2 post-docs: Spatial analysis (Mar-Dec 2019); Modeling and optimization (Oct 2019-Sep 2020).
