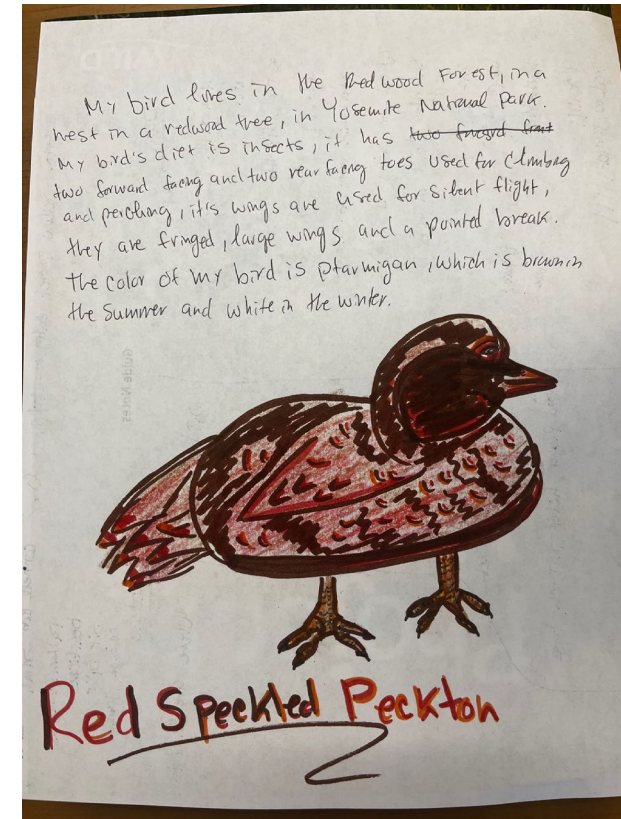


Grant Goals and Objectives

GOAL: Drive Educator Excellence through developing a cadre of educators and trainers who are environmentally literate and better prepared to be effective environmental educators.

Objectives

- Deliver in-service educator training that builds on existing quality environmental education programs.
- Increase outreach to diverse populations (including geographical diversity).
- Increase delivery of wildlife and climate change professional development to in-service educators.
- Deliver pre-service educator training that enables faculty and instructors in education departments at colleges and universities to effectively include environmental education in their courses. Special emphasis on working with HBCU's and Tribal colleges.

The Highlights

- Project WILD has \$10,000 available for training IN-SERVICE educators (formal and non-formal) in Project WILD, Aquatic WILD, or Flying WILD.
- \$6,000 is available for training PRE-SERVICE educators and COLLEGE FACULTY in Project WILD, Aquatic WILD, Flying WILD, or Climate & Wildlife.
- Growing Up WILD is not eligible
- Food costs are not eligible

Participating as a Project WILD Sub-Recipient

- Must submit an RFP
- Must submit an interim and final report
- All work must be complete by October 1, 2026
- 1 guide received = 1 educator trained

 - Number of guides you are requesting
 - In-person, Online, Hybrid
- Goal of the workshop
- List two outcomes of the workshop
 - Value added; the impact; the knowledge gained; behavior changed

RFP (Continued)

- Funding Request Details
 - Total dollar amount for guides. Use *Project WILD Year Five ee360+ Coordinator Order Form* to calculate total
 - Funding cannot be used for food or indirect expenses.



Reporting

- Final Report is due October 1, 2026. It must Include:
 - Agenda
