- 2023 Conservation Education Conference Discussion 30min. Tabbi
 - Pulse to see who attended the last CE conference earlier this year—about ½ of today's participants attended
 - Is this something we want to do every other year? Have it on the off years of the WVNT Academy, so they don't compete with each other
 - Questions- do we want this to be (1) in-person, (2) hybrid version, (3) online only
 - May want to see what is out there to see if it's really needed (ex. NAAEE (North American Association for Environmental Education) Conference, R3 Conference, etc)
 - Want to work to break down education silos \rightarrow the CE Conference can possibly do this
 - Maybe have the 2023 CE Conference me virtual and revisit the next one to be in-person or hybrid or virtual
 - A lot of support for the next one to be virtual

- Working through the pandemic- changes, innovations and lessons learned/ Lightning Round
 - AZ- grouped programs by the people they served (re-aligned) to better serve their constituents breaking down (unintentional) education silos within their agency

- AR- staff is asking if they can get alcohol at agency events (not purchased by agency, but allow [for example] a brewery to sponsor an event—does anyone do this that AR can look at
 - AZ does this with offsite partner events will share policy
 - NE have done a lot of events at breweries; it brings in a lot of people who wouldn't normally attend agency events
 - IN has also done these types of events
- NE- hit zoom events by storm to serve their constituents; including events for adults [Nature Nerd Night] to tune in during the evenings→ it's been hugely popular; shows that their agency is relevant to the general public
- NE- diving in and using the Relevancy Road Map to help shift their agency culture to be relevant to more people (non-traditional consumers)
- o OH- Started a 'Chat with a Biologist" program—it's been very popular
- NV- had to make the change to virtual which helped participation with such a rural state; helps us serve our constituents better
 - Finding some webinars doing really well and others don't... can't figure out why some are more popular than others
 - AZ- marketing is helping us; using titles with a little 'pizzazz'
