CMS

The 14th Conference of the Parties of CMS will finalize decisions on several topics of interest. Even though the US and Canada are not signatories to CMS, decisions influence the work of CITES and IUCN and therefore can influence domestic policy. The Committee will engage with the US State Department, the Canadian Wildlife Service, other partners. (continued next page)

CITES

We attended the November Standing Committee. Topics that are on our radar include American eel discussions, the nexus between reducing the risk of future pandemics and CITES, how to use available data to identify species at risk of extinction from international trade, and the development of guidance on Non-detriment Findings. The next meeting is the Animals Committee. It will be in July 2024.
