#### Convention on Migratory Species:

The 14th Conference of the Parties of CMS will finalize decisions on several topics of interest. Even though the US and Canada are not signatories to CMS, decisions influence the work of CITES and IUCN and therefore can influence domestic policy. The Committee will engage with the US State Department, the Canadian Wildlife Service, other partners as needed. Topics of interest that the Committee will consider developing recommendations for include the following:

- New Strategic Plan for Migratory Species
- Atlas of Animal Migration
- Assessment of the risk posed to CMS Appendix I-listed species by direct use and trade
- Prevention of illegal killing, taking and trade of migratory birds
- Preventing poisoning of migratory birds
- Priorities for addressing illegal and unsustainable intentional take
- Terrestrial and avian wild meat
- Wildlife disease
- Conservation implications of animal culture
