The Chihuahuan Desert

The Chihuahuan Desert supports 90% of migratory species breeding in the western Great Plains. These species have lost 70% of their global population since 1970.

The cerulean warbler is an species of greatest conservation need in 35 states whose populations have plummeted. Focal areas in South America have been identified that are critical to cerulean warbler conservation.

In 2024, enroll 20,000 more acres in the Sustainable Grazing Network (SGN) in 2024; Restore, enhance or improve at least 25,000 acres; Increase abundance and survival of species of greatest conservation need species through habitat restoration.

Create and enhance habitat for the cerulean and Canada warbler and olive-sided flycatcher.



Created a six-mile corridor between two important montane reserves in the northern Andes of Colombia through restoration, reforestation, and the promotion of shade grown coffee and cacao.
