## Project WILD (PW) Updates- Elena Takaki & Marc LeFebre (AFWA) - 10 min

- PW has been around in 1983; there are currently 7 different PW publications in circulation—this includes 3 new ones (PW Climate & Wildlife; Creciendo WILD; Wildlife Resources and Conservation in North America- and Educational Guide)
- Going more toward electronic distribution instead of hard copies
- Strength- able to make connections between our members and NGOs and other conservation partners to bring PW to educators.
- Working on a MSCG to develop 3 online education professional development courses
  - Human dimensions of wildlife conservation
  - Wildlife health/one health
  - Ecological connectivity
- EE360+ grant
  - Provide DEI training
  - Funding for strengthening Environmental Education among in-service and preservice educators
  - Mini-grants and publications to state PW hosting organizations
  - Online professional development courses in
    - PW Facilitator Training
    - WILD About Monarchs

#### Field Edventures in Wisconsin-Victoria Rydberg Nania- 15 min

- Co-coordinate Project WILD in Wisconsin with FIELD Edventures
- Helps connect the WHY it's important to connect with the outdoors
- Get educators outdoors; get kids to connect, explore and engage.
  - Connect to Wisconsin standards for environmental literacy and sustainability >
     use Project Wet and Project Wild to cover water topics and wildlife topics
- Use <u>How to Teach Nature Journaling</u>—a free pdf online
- Provide a 5-week educator workshop using an EE360+ grant around Changing Climate,
   Changing Cultures
- Limiting factors include: funding, caps on course fees, teachers lack of experience, decreed freedom in the classroom; showing value in PW

## Discussion: Next Steps in the Program Evaluation Series- All- 15 min

- Conservation Education Network- a growing group of educators that meet virtually as well as in person during the AFWA Annual Meeting and the North American Conference; includes webinars, professional development, and meetings to discuss priorities identified in the group
- One of the big items we want to discuss are Program Evaluations
  - Looking to partner with human dimensions staff to look at the evaluation process; develop evaluations that help answer some bigger questions that we would like to answer.

## Overview of Michigan's 4th Grade Program Evaluations- Kevin Frailey (MI) 20 min

- Natural resources education
- Last year was given a budget (4M) to do programing → developed program called <u>Nature</u>
   Awaits
  - Goal to get every 4<sup>th</sup> grader in a state park; have specific programing
  - o Biggest budget line item were buses to get kids to the parks
- Initial proposal = importance of public lands (Michigan parks and other public lands); health benefits to being outdoors; outdoor experiences can bolster education standards
  - Use infographics to support the initial proposal
- In Michigan all the FW divisions don't have educators; they're in a completely different section/division.
- How it works: 4<sup>th</sup> grade teachers schedule a location/time online; DNR educators meet at location with swag; spend 90 minutes with educators; students take a 5-question survey; teachers send a reimbursement form for bus travel (up to \$1000) and must take a survey of their own before money is transferred.
- 100% of teachers said would recommend this program to other teachers.
- Had 6K+ kids fill out evaluations
  - Want to know if the students had a good experience
  - Want the students to learn something
  - o Did we give them some messages important to our state agency
  - o Did they retain this information (still working on this one)
- Have a full-time marketing person, and full time person coordinating transportation
- The program was just turned into a permanent program (was only a 2yr program to start)

## New programs and partnering with the Dept of Education - Ashley Leonard (WY) 20 min

- Conservation Education in Schools in Wyoming
  - Wyoming Game & Fish Dept. partnership with Wyoming TU, TU, NASP, WDE, Wy State Board of Education.
  - Last year: hunter education, trout in the classroom, NASP, Conservation crates; total reach close to 5K students
- Trout in the Classroom- introduces students to concepts of ecology, pop biology, etc.; last year was first year of program
  - 28 schools participated; 1511 students, 20 schools released fish in 10 different locations
- NASP- an in-school target archery program
  - Was restarted last year
  - 24 schools participated

- o 2100 students
- Hosted a virtual state tournament
- Hosted 5 basic archery instructor trainings
- Trained new 39 basic archery instructors
- Hunter Education in Schools
  - Inspire your students to safely explore by teaching them to: be safe and ethical hunters, respect for firearms, gain understanding of hunting as wildlife management tool, ID participation in hunting impacts the conservation of land and other natural resources; safely explore the outdoors and watch wildlife.
  - o Incorporate hunter education into school curriculum
  - o In 20 schools; 23 courses; 354 students
- Conservation Crates: include lesson plans for all grade levels and the materials to implement them. Designed to make teaching conservation topics easy and accessible.
  - Soft launched in January 2023
  - Close to 1000 students have been exposed
  - Initial challenges: reach constituents in a large geographic area; define program values and measure success; quantify demand for programs; utilize limited personnel
  - Helps meet demands of schoolteachers have on the Wyoming Game and Fish Department

#### EdTech in Conservation Education-IHEA Jae Ellison 10 min

- Tech based solutions in the conservation space
- <u>SCOUT</u>- an Al solution
  - Provide clarity on rules and regulations
  - Closed Al model- only has access to information provided by the state agency rules and regulations (not getting data from outside sources)
  - Safeguards built in
  - Refers to rules & regulations for confirmation and continued learning
  - Used data provided to inform future rules & regulations format
  - Asking state agencies to start testing out SCOUT; hasn't publicized this to the public as of yet
  - States can request the questions most often asked about their states rules and regulations; may be used to help better communication with the public
  - SCOUT is still in the testing phase
- Outdoor Extended Learning Network
  - A network of outdoor industry Learning Management Systems that Shares educational resources while maintaining brand identity
  - 4 essential functions
    - Effective audience segmentation
    - No costs per user
    - Access to detailed student and course data
    - Professional learning designers to enhance educational outcomes
  - Examples: built courses for NWTF → Becoming a Turkey Hunting Mentor; NWTF Education & Outreach Event...
  - Allows for sharing of resources
  - Can provide reports for an organization

      - Just finished an R3 clearing house of resources
