**Committee Charge:** The Engagement and Education Committee will support and inspire AFWA member organizations and associated committees by creating tools, identifying initiatives, and promoting best practices that improve conservation connection and engagement, eliminate barriers, and develop meaningful relationships across broader conservation communities.

List Major Activities and Objectives Accomplished During the Last Year:

- 1. Update Committee name to Engagement & Education Committee (previously Education, Outreach and Diversity Committee).
- 2. Update committee and working group charges to better reflect new name.
- 3. Update the Diversity & Inclusion Working Group name to Engagement & Connections Working Group
- 4. Engagement & Connections: continuation of the Coffee Talk Series which highlights engagement work and promotes open discussion in a safe space.
- 5. Wildlife Viewing & Nature Tourism: worked with Vtech on Recommendations for Removing Barriers to Wildlife-related Recreation for People with Disabilities
- 6. Coordinated a successful Wildlife Viewing & Nature Tourism Academy.
- Project WILD- continued Project WILD online professional development course and developed thematic units.
- 8. The EEC and WDCF Joint working group help develop bullet point fact sheets that can be given to Hill staffers to keep Recovering America's Wildlife Act top of mind; will wait until after the election to prioritize efforts
- 9. Conservation Education (CE) network meets virtually 4x per year, then also at the North American Conference and AFWA Annual Meeting; looking at possible 2 tracks of CE in the future: 1) on the ground educators, 2) CE administrators
- 10. Coordinated an Engagement Academy for state agency at NCTC.
- 11. Coordinated an Engagement Workshop (Workshop on Inclusive Recruitment & Retention of Agency Employees) at the 2024 AFWA Annual Meeting.
- 12. Monthly committee/working group chair calls.
- 13. Continuation of quarterly (or as needed) EEC member calls.
- 14. Outreach & Marketing Working Group worked with Southwick Associates to develop *Public Perceptions of State Fish and Wildlife Agencies*
- 15. Outreach & Marketing MSCG Rebranding, Repiloting, and Reevaluating the National Conservation Outreach Strategy and Relevancy Toolkit will be extended so not to test during the election time.

- 2. Conduct the 6<sup>th</sup> WVNT Academy Feb 2026
- 3. Plan and conducted an Engagement workshop; coordinate with AFWA staff to create and administer a DEI internship; continue to conduct Coffee Talks
- 4. Continue with monthly phone calls with the committee/subcommittee/working group chairs; continue with quarterly (or as needed) calls with the EOD membership.
- 5. Education WG is looking to partner with human dimensions staff to look at the evaluation process; develop evaluations that help answer some bigger questions that we would like to answer.
- 6. Wildlife Viewing and Nature Tourism Working Group will work with VTech on 2025 MSCG: Supporting inclusion of disabled wildlife viewers in state agency programs by conducting and sharing findings from case studies.

- 2. Revised the following online courses: Project WILD, Aquatic WILD, Flying WILD, and Climate & Wildlife. Created a new course called "WILD About Bats". All of this work was made possible due to funding through an EPA ee360+ grant.
- 3. Launched and administered Year 4 EE360+ Seed Grants to states.
- 4. Provided professional development for Project WILD network through 1) monthly online meetings to address implementation of Project WILD at the state level and learning about new developments in wildlife conservation education.
- 5. Co-hosted the first Project WET/Project WILD/Project Learning Tree conference since 1996. Over 150 attendees.

- 1. Develop two new online courses related to vector-disease transmission.
- 2. Continue development and improvement of existing online courses.
