- Increasing Program Impact Through Partnerships: Boating Education- Josh Hoffman (AZ) 20 min
  - Benefits that partnerships bring to our programs; when you do something together, it may take longer to get where you're going but the results are significantly better and impactful; boating education and safety incorporated into each aspect of the programs developed
  - Three main categories or partnerships: 1) Agencies; 2) state, county, and city; and 3)
     Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)
    - Agency = Arizona Game & Fish
      - Wildlife Viewing Program → bighorn sheep tours; kayaking and birding clinics
      - Field Biology → Apple snail surveys; goose banding
      - Agency Messaging → Aquatic Invasives; Fishing Education; Hunter Safety
    - States, County and City
      - State Parks and Trails → Family camping program (paddle sports, bow-fishing, kayak-fishing, risk management, staff training)
      - County Parks → boat AZ and paddle sports classes; training & equipment
      - City of Prescott → paddle sports activities; mutual support
    - NGO
      - Becoming an Outdoor Woman- support events with hands on kayaking classes
      - National Turkey Federation bi-annual Jakes events with kids and kayaks

- AZ Veterans Fly Fishing- hands on kayaking training with emphasis on fishing
- Cast for kids- loaning life jackets for participants; providing inflatable life jackets to captains that take pledge to wear life jackets
- Partnerships = Possibilities
  - Allows you to become part of someone else's success → making a difference
- Succession Planning- Future topic from last meeting- open discussion- All- 20 min
  - There has been a lot of turnover in positions; has anyone done succession planning to help prepare for this to make sure we keep some of this institutional knowledge.
    - What are the needs? Webinars, something else?
    - Who has done this? Any success?
      - IHEA has tried this without much success; looking for pointers
    - What are the components that need to be included?
      - AZ has started to have this discussion; but no products as of yet
      - Alabama has started to do 'training up' and 'training down' so others
        are familiar with what other staff are doing and how to do it; some
        resistance to what a staff member is doing (and if they are the only ones
        that can do it) is a source of power and security.
      - Learning staff need more onboarding materials; this idea can be cross pollinated between the two (onboarding + succession planning)
      - TX will re-position/re-classify (receive same salary, etc.) an employee who is about to retire so they can advertise their position early and have them around to help train the new employee.
      - Louisiana has the ability to have 180 days for two people (one outgoing one incoming) in the same position so proper success training can take place.
      - FL- is trying to come up with a career development program; find ways
        to grow professionally without necessarily going into a higher position
        that a person is not well suited for (ie. Supervisory position) where you
        can still get pay increases, etc.
      - There is a need to transition a new person to continue to maintain/grow external partnerships.
      - AZ- looking at giving shadowing opportunities to learn skills that staff may want to learn (ie. managing program budget, etc.)
      - Creating an Agency Resource Guide is important so people feel empowered to do some things on their own and not have to constantly ask how to do a necessary task.
      - Sometimes it's better to hire a consultant to help with these tasks (onboarding/ succession planning); staff bandwidth is low, and it can be hard or impossible to make happen.
      - A recent survey showed that employees in state fish & wildlife agencies took their position because they love the natural resources and don't want to sit behind a desk all the time → created an engagement opportunity board where people can sign up to go out in the field to so/help with some of the field work; a perk of joining the agencies even if not as a field biologist.
