- Focus on ESA and SGCN
- NEED: Give 2 bullet points on species that were kept off the ESA list because of the work that state fish & wildlife agencies have done; preventing regulation because of the work of state FW agencies in keeping species off the ESA list.

 - Make SWAP more actionable and understandable
- Show why you want to put funding toward SWAPs → marketing to potential partners and funders
- Create internal and external communication plans

PRIORITY LIST THAT WAS REQUESTED:

Request: 2-3 bullets of species (preferably SGCN, but other species including plants are fine) that were downlisted, delisted, found not warranted for listing, or even prevented from being petitioned/considered and include any credit that can be given to SWAPs, investments of STWGs, or habitat/ecosystem work where benefits to the species were secondary. In the example:

- Helpful if can show where habitat is and what Congressional District(s) it falls under.
- Good to explain what land use, commerce, investment, or development of any kind has occurred within that habitat.
- Good to highlight what resources were invested in that species' habitat by either partners or the state.
- Worth highlighting where SWAP projects would be implemented and how much would be invested in those areas with full funding of SWAP.
